




Top 10 Things You Should Know About DVR

Vocational Rehabilitation


- Get A Job DVR is here to help you find a job, keep a job, or get a better job.
- Eligibility
 You are eligible for DVR services if you have a disability that makes it hard for you to find or keep a job and you need DVR services to help with your disability limitations. After you apply, DVR has 60 days to decide if you are eligible. You may be eligible for DVR services if you have a disability and you need DVR services to help with employment.
- Confidential Information about your DVR case is protected by confidentiality rules, which your counselor will explain.
- Waiting List
 When DVR cannot serve everyone who applies,
 we use a waiting list called Order of Selection. If
 you are put on the waiting list, DVR will contact
 you when you can receive services.
- 5 Choose your job goal
 You will work with your counselor to choose an appropriate job goal and the services need to reach you goal. DVR will give you the help you need to make informed choices about your services. You and your DVR counselor will agree to your Individualized Plan for Employment.
- Many No Cost Services
 There is no charge to you for evaluation, counseling, job development and placement or post-employment services. You may be required to share the cost of some services, but your counselor will talk to you about any costs before services start.


- Issue Resolution
 If you disagree with a decision that DVR makes, you can contact the Client Assistance Program (CAP) at 800-362-1290 for help or to assist with an appeal. CAP can help explain the DVR process, why and how decisions are made and may help resolve problems.
- 8 Stay Connected
 DVR can't help you if you don't share information about your life.
 - Contact DVR at least once a month more often if anything changes with your case.
 - Call if you are going to miss a meeting with DVR.
- Taking Responsibility
 Between your meetings with DVR staff you will be asked to do the things listed in your Individualized Plan for Employment as your responsibility. Your Individualized Plan for Employment is written to help you reach your goal take responsibility for your program.
 - Goal Reached
 When you have received the services listed in your Individualized Plan for Employment and you have reached your job goal, your DVR case will be closed. Your counselor will talk to you before your case is closed. You can reapply for DVR if something changes in your life and you need our employment services again.



Pathways for Parents after Incarceration

- Are you the <u>caregiver</u> of a child who is 3-17 years old whose father:
 - ✓ Has regular contact with the child or plays a parenting role?
 - ✓ Was recently released from prison or jail?
- ✓ Are you 18 years old or older?

If so, you are invited to take part in a virtual, family-focused program for fathers and caregivers that supports father involvement and positive parenting after incarceration.

If you join, you and the child's father will participate in a live, video-based parenting class and peer support group that will last about 3 hours, once a week for 8 weeks.

Gift cards for food and safe activities for families will be provided.

For your time, you and your child's father will each receive up to \$16c



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Within a classroom culture of healing, nurturance, and love, and through the use of small and large group activities, children will grow in their ability to connect and make friends with others, calm and regulate their emotions, and grow in their self-esteem.

Parent Quotes:

"We've noticed improvements in our child's ability to talk about and regulate her emotions. I really feel like the small class size and high level of adult support was key in that growth."

"When we first enrolled, I understood that our child would be supported in the classroom, but I didn't expect to gain so much from our parent meetings. Having that time set aside to reflect on family goals and growth has really helped us."

Reach Dane opened a therapeutic preschool classroom for 3 year-olds in the Fall of 2021. The goal of the classroom is to provide access to learning for children that have experienced trauma or other social inequities that may put them at risk of experiencing achievement gaps.

Family Engagement

Families are an essential part of the classroom team along with the classroom staff and the Child and Family Resilience Specialist.

Parents participate in the Your Journey Together resilience-building parenting curriculum. This program builds on the strengths of the family and provides simple, everyday ways to build parent relationships with their child and supports family wellbeing.

Our Program



ELIGIBLE CHILDREN

Children that meet the Federal requirements for Head Start AND have experienced trauma, extreme stressors, or other factors that parents or caregivers believe could put their child at risk for missing developmental learning outcomes.

CURRICULUM

The children will gain social emotional (ex. empathy, kindness) and problem-solving skills (ex. sharing, taking turns) in a play-based and age-appropriate environment. Each day the children will receive 2 meals and play outdoors (weather permitting).

CLASS SIZE

The classroom will have only up to 8 children enrolled. This is intentional so that children will receive many opportunities for learning and growth.





Communities thrive when everyone has the chance to live a healthy, productive life, but sometimes people face challenges too hard to overcome alone. JustDane offers hope and a hand up. We are a private, 501(c)3 nonprofit serving people returning from prison and jail, children who have an incarcerated parent, and community members facing barriers to success. JustDane builds empathy and helps people understand how to support effective policies and initiatives to strengthen our community.

Just Bakery

Just Bakery is a social justice enterprise working with individuals who face significant employment barriers such as homelessness, lack of work history or skills, mental health challenges, or involvement in the justice system. Through classroom learning, hands-on practice and customer service, students become certified bakers, can earn college credits, and get a fresh start in life.

Just Bakery products are for sale online and in the community. We re-invest all proceeds to support the bakery.



Journey Home

The Journey Home program is a re- entry initiative designed to immediately connect returnees to a complex network of services in Dane County. JustDane's Reentry Resource Specialists assist program participants to find the following core supports to re-establish themselves in the community:

Residence-Employment-Support-Education-Treatment-Transportation

Peer Support

Someone who has been released from incarceration often finds reentry overwhelming, and circumstances that contributed to incarceration may still be present. JustDane's certified Peer Support Specialists serve as skilled guides. Their lived experience gives them unique ability to encourage their peers to build on personal strengths as they connect to local resources and support. With mutual understanding, peers work together to navigate the reentry process.



Circles of Support

For people coming home from prison it can be a challenge to avoid old lifestyle decisions that led to incarceration in the first place. Positive support and feedback make a huge difference. JustDane's Circles of Support are made up of 5-6 community volunteers, and one individual recently released from an institution. They meet weekly to decide on small, achievable goals that build personal support networks and success. Most circles last six months and end when the group agrees things are going well. Our restorative circle model demonstrates that people do indeed turn their lives around.

Healing House

Located in Madison, Healing House is an 8-bed facility, providing 24/7 recuperative care to families that are homeless and have an immediate family member in need of ongoing care during recovery after a medical procedure. Trained staff and volunteers provide care, meals and childcare assistance for up to 28 days. Our partner, The Road Home, provides housing case management.





Just Connections

JustDane supports children impacted by parental incarceration. Our Just Connections initiatives maintain family bonds by accompanying children on visits to mothers in prison, by connecting children and their parents through our books-on-video reading program, and by matching children with adult mentors.

Re-Entry Simulation

This JustDane workshop is an immersion experience that leaves participants with a deep understanding of recidivism. It prepares the community to support reentry success and policy reform.


